Minutes of the August 7, 2013 VAOS Meeting

Cynthia Vance opened the meeting welcoming the many guests, noting this is a joint meeting of the Englewood Area Orchid Society and VAOS. She asked for a show of hands from members of the Englewood Area Orchid Society, and then the Sarasota Orchid Society. Guests who had attended previous meetings and Growers Clinics were invited to join VAOS for an annual cost of only \$15 for a household. She encouraged members and guests to purchase raffle tickets and welcomed our speaker, Roy Tokunaga, from Hawaii.

Upcoming Events were printed and placed on seats. Information about those events, including next week's Growers Clinic, the Holiday Party on Dec. 7th, and the Sept. 14-15 Ridge Orchid Show in Lakeland, FL was discussed. The Ridge Show theme is "Orchids, the Fountain of Youth." Cynthia urged members to carefully prepare their plants for the show. They may bring show plants to the Sept. 12th Growers Clinic and Rich Amos and Jimmy Thomas will bring them to the Show. A used Dell computer with OrchidWiz Software was offered for sale by Bill Timm, via a Silent Auction. All proceeds were donated to VAOS.

Cynthia briefly discussed new financial procedures for the Society. Forms will now be used when members request reimbursement for Society expenses. These procedures will improve the process of managing Society finances.

Bill Fender introduced our speaker, Roy Tokunaga of H & R Orchids. Bill and Susan have purchased orchids from Roy for more than 20 years. Roy gave an excellent PowerPoint presentation entitled "Looking for Flower Booster." He detailed how the balance of light, water and fertilizer boosts blooming for orchids. He discussed the PH level of water and how it may affect orchids.

Plant Table Awards August 7, 2013

The plant table reflected the slow days of August.

Spring bloomers have come and gone – the fall blooming season awaits. The outstanding plants that won the night's awards were:

The **First Place** Ribbon and **Members' Choice** award was earned by Judy Russell with an attractive intermediate sized hybrid, Rlc. Angel Lace. This is a cross made by Carter and Holmes of C. Little Angel, a white flower, and the well-known frilly-lipped species, Rl. digbyana. The color is as expected from the hybrid and the lip brings forward some of the interesting structure of the

Rl. digbyana lip. The five flowers caught everyone's eye. Congratulations, Judy!!

The **Second Place** ribbon and **Speaker's Choice** award went to the Brassavola nodosa, well-known to our plant table and providing an outstanding display. The species



is wide spread throughout Central America and northern South America. While described as intermediate to warm growing, many VAOS members grow it cooler and attach it to trees. Cynthia Vance was the exhibitor and grew this specimen size plant in just two years after receiving it as a gift from Roy Klinger. Great job, Cynthia!

Anna Sibille earned both the **Third Place** ribbon and **Best Species** award with her Cycnoches loddgesii (right), a plant native to northern South America. The plant grows rapidly in the warm summers, blooms, and looses its leaves in the fall. The bulbs will dry out over the win-

ter and produce a new bulb next season. The plant shown

appears to have male flowers as the female flowers are usually fleshy with a shorter column. Thank you for bringing it in, Anna!

Joanna Shaw received the New Members' ribbon with her entry Rlc. Eagle Island 'Sangria'(below). The cross was registered by Carter and Holmes in the same year as Rlc. Angel Lace above. The Sangria clone earned an AM/AOS award for Carter and Holmes when they exhibited it in the Atlanta Orchid

brings 20+ years of non-profit management to the VAOS Board, suggested we develop more stringent financial procedures to incorporate best practices in accounting for our growing society. Our new financial internal control system will safeguard assets, prevent errors, provide credible information, and protect both VAOS directors and members. Thank you, Janice, Carol and Ali for your contributions to this board committee as we work to finalize these procedures.

Here are just a few of the changes: Our financial record-keeping will be password protected, held in a secure location, and off-site copies will be maintained in a free digital storage system. Forms to obtain reimbursement of funds are included and matched to the budget category and then approved by the president. Forms for income received will also be used. All checks sent to VAOS will be directed to our official PO Box. We are pleased that our long-time member, Elaine Ortt, who has extensive experience in tax preparation and finance, has agreed to review our financial record-keeping quarterly.

If an unusual event forces us to cancel our annual Show, we always keep enough funds in the bank to carry VAOS through the following year of operations, including seed money for the next Show. I trust that through all these efforts, VAOS members can be assured of our Society's diligent financial management to safeguard and manage our assets.

Simple Fertilizer Mixing

Over the years, many people have utilized the various fertilizer calculators we have provided here on this website. Some however, are not so interested in the more technical approaches to fertilizer management, so here we seek to provide a much simpler method. All you need to do is estimate how frequently you water and feed your plants, and refer to the chart below as a reference.

Let's start with a general recommendation: we have found that if you feed your plants at every watering, a nitrogen concentration of about 50- to 75 ppm appears to be good for a wide array of genera. Therefore, if you feed your plants every other watering, then it seems reasonable to apply the fertilizer at approximately twice that concentration. If you fertilize plants less frequently than that, it would seem logical to simply use the appropriate multiplier to determine your concentration, but we must keep in mind that too strong of a solution can be damaging, particularly to more sensitive plants. That is one reason we always recommend dilute, frequent feeding as opposed to stronger, more spaced-out feedings. Using our own nutritional analogy, it's healthier to eat several small snacks then to gorge yourself at one big meal.

I'm not going to "let you off the hook" from doing math altogether, but this is actually pretty simple. First, decide what concentration in ppm N that you're shooting for. In the chart, simply select the factor next to that value and divide it by the %N on the label of your fertilizer. The result is the number of teaspoons to use to mix up a gallon

of fertilizer. The metric factor, when divided by the %N, gives the milliliters to use for a liter of solution.

Concentration ppm N	Factor (English)	
250	20	26
225	18	23.4
200	16	20.8
175	14	18.2
150	12	15.6
125	10	13
100	8	10.4
75	6	7.8
50	4	5.2

For example, if I am shooting for 75 ppm and have a 19-7-13 fertilizer, then I will mix 6/19=0.32, or roughly 1/3 of a teaspoon, per gallon of solution. If doing a metric calculation for the same concentration, I would divide 7.8 by the 19% N, and use 0.4 ml/L.
