Topic: "What's Wrong With My Orchid?"

Vern Bloch is a retired Navy pilot who first became interested in orchids after leaving the service in 1987. Two years later, Vern, and his wife, Helen, became owners of the Palm Bay Orchid Range and participated in many orchid shows around the state. They sold the nursery in 2004 but continue to do business on a small scale. For



the past twenty years, Vern has conducted programs for numerous orchid societies ranging from the Florida Keys to North Carolina.

Vern's main interest has always been in the cattleya alliance and he previously gave a great presentation on the subject of Encyclias and Epidendrum, dispelling much of the mystery surrounding these similar and often misclassified and mislabeled genera.

This time, Vern will be answering the eternal question in the minds of all orchid growers: "What's Wrong With My Orchid". He will have a short PowerPoint presentation and bring some examples of typical problem plants. He will guide us through the process of eliminating common causes until we reach the correct solution to our particular problem. Vern loves to answer questions, so make sure you come with a lot of them.

He'll be bringing a nice selection of flowering orchids, especially Encyclias, for sale.

The newsletter will be providing the most current annual schedules for both the monthly meetings and the Growers Clinics as part of the Culture Supplement following the regular newsletter. We hope that this will keep our members up to date with even greater participation.

### Plant Table Awards March 3, 2016

So many of our members' beautiful and best plants had been taken over to the EAOS show to be in the VAOS exhibit, that we only had 5 plants on the plant table this evening. Each of them received a well-deserved award.

The First Place Blue Ribbon was captured by Janet Keown for her magnificent Ryncholaeliocattleya (Rlc.) Dr. Joe Walker 'Ray Mishima'. The beautiful white trimmed fuchsia and yellow ruffle made these flowers really stand out. Registered in 1994 by J.L. Walker, this plant is a hybrid of 10 other ruffled species with C. *dowiana* making up 1/3 of the plant. Congrats to Janet for growing such a beauty!!

The Second Place Red Ribbon went to Cynthia Vance for her new Rhyncattleanthe (Rhy.) Fuch's Orange Nuggett 'Lea'. She purchased it at our show from Odom's Orchids because she likes the plump roots; R.F. Orchids, Homestead, FL, gifted hybridists, created the plant. At purchase, it was only in bud and then most of the flowers came out simultaneously, making it a showy specimen. Kudos to Cynthia for keeping it alive for at least 4 weeks!

The Third Place Yellow Ribbon was awarded to John Roche for his darling pink Epidendrum (Epi.) *centropetalum*. Notice the second word of this plant name is italicized and not capitalized. This denotes that the plant is a species (found in nature) and is not a hybrid created by a grower. It grows mostly in Nicaragua, Costa Rica, and Panama -- as an epiphyte 'mounted' on forest trees in the mountains. It's cool that John mounts it so it feels at home. Good work, John!

The Best Species Purple Ribbon was garnered by James Thomas for his flashy orange Cattleya (C.) *aurantiaca*. Now called, Guarianthe (Gur.) *aurantiaca*, this plant was discovered by Bateman in 1840 and it loves to grow on the sides of trees in Nicaragua and Mexico. Here Jimmy has created a beautiful mount on cedar wood which allows it to create its orange clusters in a multiflorous presentation. Beautiful mounting, Jimmy!

### **Culture Tip of the Month**

This tip is from the last Growers Clinic where I brought my sickly Den. Burana Fancy x Thonchai Gold, a mericlone that I had bought at Home Depot. With its sparse yellowed leaves, it was a long way from the red ribbon winner at last year's Orlando Show.

Having seen no sign of insect pests and not having subjected it to any winter temperatures below 60 degrees, I had tried at least three fungicides in the last two months, all without any noticeable result.

There was some discussion as to the fertilizer used and the application frequency, supplements, etc. but the suggestion from Renee Bynum, our new Director at Large, proved to be the eye opener. She was quite certain that it was not a fungus problem and asked whether I had removed it from its pot to look at the roots. I had looked at

The Phal was mounted in a conch shell with a small tillandsia bromeliad to give the presentation balance. Such wonderful artistry! half the plant and made the diagnosis, without considering that the roots were just as important, if not more so than the pseudobulbs and leaves, in the health of my orchid.

The next morning, after soaking the pot to loosen the rots, I examined the roots and media and immediately saw that the media had decomposed substantially over three years and that many of the roots were either rotten or well on the way. Trimming the dead roots, replacing the media with medium Orchiata bark over a layer of non-biodegradable foam peanuts for drainage and a quick soak in Mega-Thrive, should get the plant well on the way to recovery. As any doctor will tell you, half a diagnosis is twice as dangerous and misleading as no diagnosis at all.

**Point to Remember**: Once you've eliminated the insect pests, don't reach for chemicals until you're sure that the media is fresh and that the roots are functioning!! Removing the orchid from its pot is not difficult or damaging as long as you take the time to soak the pot.




Jane just turned 85 and while she will continue to purchase items throughout the year to sell at the show, Janet Hoy will assume management

# When to Start Fertilizing in Spring February 2013

The only real rule of orchid growing is that the rules are just guidelines. Winter was brief and many different orchids are blooming earlier and initiating growth early relative to most years. Orchids that rely on day length instead of temperature for blooming are following their normal blooming and growth pattern. Readers of this column know my normal advice is to limit fertilizer applications to warmer months, but this year is different because the environment where my orchids are growing has been different. My orchids that rely on temperature to start are in a different growth stage than those that rely on day length. How do I know that some have started their growth cycle and others not? Should fertilizing applications begin if some orchids are growing and others are not?

There are many hanging orchids in my greenhouse, not just because of space, but because they are some of the "canaries" that tell me how my orchids are interpreting light levels and temperatures. Especially important in my greenhouse are bifoliate cattleyas, such as C. leopoldii and C guttata. When these species initiate their new growth, spring is officially here no matter what the calendar says and they are getting close to initiating new growths.

Many of my spring blooming cattleyas and paphs are orchids that use temperature to tell them when to grow and flower. Unfortunately, this year these will be finished flowering when the spring orchid shows need exhibition plants. Many of these have almost always bloomed within a week or so of the same time each year, but this year will be an exception based on buds I see swelling in the sheaths.

When orchids initiate new growths, it is time to begin using fertilizer regularly and at higher doses. After several months of flushing during the fall and winter, nutrients adhering to media have largely been lost or used up. During the last several years, I have limited fertilizers in an attempt to avoid producing lush foliage that can be attacked by bacteria and fungi.

There are some orchids that do receive regular fertilizer, albeit at lower levels in winter. Those include orchids that are growing and blooming such as phals and paphs, which I keep in different places. Many cymbidium growers follow a similar fertilizer regimen, but use fertilizer higher in phosphorus, the middle number, starting in fall.

Hobbyists with just a few plants have an easier time making the decision because they can look at each plant and decide to fertilize or not. This is really easy if Nutricote, which lasts six months, is your fertilizer of choice. The balanced formulation is an excellent one for all orchids and safe to use. I usually add it to the surface of the medium in early March, but recommend adding it now if your orchids are starting to grow new leaves or breaking eyes for new pseudobulbs. If you cannot find Nutricote in your local store, check with Carter & Holmes Orchids. They sell small quantities. If your temperatures

have not been as warm as here in north Florida, you might need to wait a little longer. Let your orchids tell you when you need to begin adding fertilizer.

It will be interesting to see if there will be extra bulbs or leaves this year with a longer growing season.

*Editor's notes:* Although the article was written in 2013, it could just as well have been written for this year as conditions are similar, if not identical.

Experts from our Growers Clinic recommend the use of Dynamite extended release fertilizer (in the red container), available from Home Depot and identical to Nutricote, but in smaller sizes. Osmacote is not an acceptable substitute in our climatic conditions.
