# Next Meeting: Thursday, Mar. 2, 7 pm Venice Community Center (doors open at 6:30 pm) Speaker: Stig Dalström

**Topic:** Orchids of the Himalayas

Born and raised in Sweden, Stig became a US citizen in 2007 after having been considered "an alien with extraordinary ability" by the US Immigration Service in 1997. He has



degrees in civil engineering and horticulture, is a self-taught watercolor artist, botanical illustrator and experienced orchid taxonomist. He now resides in Sarasota, Florida and is the former Curator of the Orchid Identification Center of the Marie Selby Botanical Gardens, specializing in the identification and classification of certain Andean orchid genera.

Although officially retired, he also focuses on studying the orchid flora of the Himalayas in general and of Bhutan in particular, where he assists the government in developing orchid research and conservation programs. A number of expeditions into isolated areas of the Kingdom of Bhutan have been organized in collaboration with staff from the National Biodiversity Centre (an independent branch of the Ministry of Agriculture and Forests) in Serbithang, Thimpu.

These efforts have added more than 100 new orchid records for the country since 2002, and several species new to science. The Royal Botanic Garden has received a partial face-lift, an orchid display house has been created and a micro-propagation laboratory has been established.

A number of his much-appreciated orchid articles have been published and read by hundreds of scientists and orchid lovers. His latest work is "A Century of New Orchid Records in Bhutan", dedicated to the new Crown Prince of Bhutan, and published on his 1st birthday this month.

Stig is a highly regarded speaker and will instruct and entertain you with tales of his latest travels, augmented by his great digital presentation. He will have a selection

#### Plant Table Awards for February 2017

The First Place Blue Ribbon was captured by Jimmy Thomas for his fragrant and gorgeous Rhyncholaelio-cattleya (Rlc.) Pink Empress 'Jur-Sen' AM/AOS, created by Mr. Moriyasu Akasuka, a prominent and respected grower of original Cattleya hybrids in Hawaii. The colors, and especially the size of the flower, were staggering. If you were enthralled by its beauty and must have it in your collection, check out Akasuka Orchid Gardens online and type 'pink empress' in the search box. Amazing specimen, Jimmy!

The Second Place Ribbons went to Carol Wolfers for her darling mini-phalaenopsis which had a Cattleya tag that 'jumped' from another plant. Many U.S. growers have stopped competing with the Taiwanese market in selling phals, but if you love the minis, they can be found at Lowe's or Home Depot. Remember, you must quickly repot your purchase due to overwatering in transit as many roots may be dead. Repotting during blooming will not hurt a phal and the minis make delightful table centerpieces. Thank you, Carol!

The Third Place Yellow Ribbon was awarded to Joanna Shaw's Ryncholaeliocattleya (Rlc.) Young Kong "#16". It was a very healthy plant with three blooms and its apple green leaves, which most of our orchids should have due to bright light, indicating good blooms are on the way. The green and pink contrasting colors make this flower a favorite among hobbyists. It can be found at Plantio La Orquidea in Sarasota, one of our VAOS show vendors. Congratulations, Joanna!

The Best Species Ribbon went to Donn Smart for his charming Paphiopedilum (Paph.) *venustum* x sib with its interesting lip design. This species originates from Bangladesh, the eastern Himalayas and east Asia. Orchid species have very particular needs to thrive and if you want this challenge, the species can be found at the trusted Ironwood Estate Orchids, NC. Or you may visit our nearby VAOS show vendor, Palmer Orchids, to view their various hybrid paphs which are easier to grow. Congrats, Donn for this amazing plant!

The New Member Growers Ribbon was granted to Joanne Britton for her lovely Phalaenopsis (Phal.) Jiaho's Pink Girl #3, which had dreamy pink petals and sepals and a striking shaped lip. This mini-phal hybrid was created by Shining Orchids, Taiwan, which goes out of the way to develop specific new Phalaenopsis varieties by customer request, producing more than 1 million plants per year. Joanne grows it in an appealing coconut shell. Beautiful job, Joanne!

**The Members Choice Green Ribbon** went to Joanna Shaw for her Epilaeliocattleya (Eplc.) Rene Marques 'Flame Thrower' with unusual and striking multi-colored flowers. It's a cross between Epidendrum (Epi.) *pseudo-epidendrum* x Cattleya Claesiana.

Joanna said that in the last few years it had 3 spikes, but this year it has 5 with more than 25 flowers and is 2 feet tall. If you didn't purchase it at our VAOS show, our vendors most likely will have more next year. Great growing, Joanna!

The Speaker's Commendation Ribbon was awarded to Donn Smart for his Paphiopedilum (Paph.) *philippinense* var *laevigatum*, another species. It is found at sea level up to 1600 feet primarily in the Philippines, hence its name. Donn's plant is a wonderful specimen with 12+ flowers! We love the long corkscrew sepals with the purple and white striped 'sail' at the top!

Check out our VAOS show vendor, Phelps Farm, Tampa, if you desire this species. Wonderful specimen, Donn!

### Culture Tip For March 2017 Basic Treatments for Common Pests

At our Growers Clinic, many of our members are new growers or growers with small collections. We are often asked the best treatments for common pests in our area. Common pests are thrips, scale, aphids, ants and mealy bugs. We always recommend a non-chemical home remedy or commercially available contact pesticide first. Here is the basic home remedy we recommend with some variations:

- 50% alcohol (drugstore 70% isopropyl rubbing alcohol) + 50% water + a few drops Dawn liquid dish detergent to make 1 Qt.
- May add 1 tsp Neem Oil
- May add 2 cinnamon sticks (bacterial infections)

Spray every few days for 2-3 weeks directly on flowers,

buds and leaves to eliminate pests.

If you prefer to buy a pre-mixed pesticide, there are several commercially available contact pesticides available from the big box stores. They include Orange Guard (especially effective with ants); Neem Oil; All Seasons Oil; and Sevin (avoid oils during hot weather or direct sunshine). Spray once a week for 2 - 3 weeks.

Systemic pesticides such as Orthene WP 97 or Merit 75 are only recommended for large-scale infestations and require special precautions.

Please join us at the next Growers Clinic on March 9th when we will have the first of our Hands-on Dividing and Repotting Clinics. Bring your problem plants for expert advice. Guests are welcome.

Our 17 show vendors this year included 10 quality growers, four member artists and a supply vendor, all of whom were pleased with their sales and the quality of our show. The displays were exceptional this year and included nine vendor commercial displays, four society displays and the VAOS educational display. Nineteen VAOS trophies were awarded. Our VAOS display took 1st Place Society Displays, Sarasota Orchid Society took 2nd place and Englewood Orchid Society took 3rd place. The Art Stone/Palmer display took 1st place among the commercial displays. The AOS Trophy, awarded at the discretion of the judges with 13 displays to consider, went to VAOS – congratulations, Jay Loeffler! VAOS members came away with 52 ribbons and six trophies and a record of 98 plants were registered by our members. Well done!

Show attendance was just under 4000 this year and net show proceeds will fund our society for the year. Show profit and membership dues provide our primary source of revenue to cover our ever-increasing expenses in facility rent, meeting and speaker expenses and society programs and social events. In years when our

budget allows, we increase our subsidies for social events (picnic, Redland bus, holiday party, etc.) to hold down our members cost. We also evaluate and increase our charitable donations to orchid conservation and local community organizations.

To our Army of Volunteers – if you enjoyed working the show, please do not wait until next year to join in! We invite you to join one of the several committees and projects that need your help. They include our Social Committee (monthly meeting refreshments, picnic, Redland bus and holiday party); our Welcoming Committee (greet and host new members at our monthly meetings); the Venice Orchid Project (prep and establish plants in our city parks and public areas); and our Growers Clinic Team (work with new members during repotting workshops, etc.). I am extremely proud to be a part of this Society. We will continue to thrive and grow from the active and enthusiastic participation of you, our members. Congratulations to all of you for a successful show!

structed to be placed in the corner and covered with faux brick "3d" wallpaper. We even fooled the judges (they thought we did a real brick and mortar wall). #### Hands-on Division and Potting Clinic, Thursday, March 9, 2017 Doors open at 6:45 pm for social; presentation begins promptly at 7:00 pm

Joanna Shaw and her team will present a combined Hands-on Orchid Division and Repotting session at the Venice Community Center at 7:00 p.m. They'll explain the supplies, tools and planting media, demonstrate basic procedures and share their tips of the trade. Participants will then divide/repot their own orchid with the assistance of several experienced growers and helpers. We'll work in teams of 4 or 5 around a table with each person bringing an orchid that needs division/repotting or simply repotting, as well as a suitable pot to replant the orchid and a sterile pair of shears. If you do not have an orchid to repot, check the Raffle Table, or the vendor tables at our March 2 meeting for suitable divisions.

With only two hours available and a large turnout

expected, it's critical that everyone adhere to the instructions below:

- 1. Only one plant per person. All plants must be removed from their pot and all old planting media and dead roots must be removed prior to the clinic. A jet of water from a garden hose will help in removing old media. Please make sure your plant is free from pests or diseases.
- 2. Media and supplies for Phalaenopsis, Cattleya alliance, and Dendrobiums will be provided. Please contact Joanna at rsec@vaos.org NOT LATER than Thursday, March 2nd, or at the monthly meeting on that date, if you are planning to bring other orchids. This is not a Potting without Pots or mounting clinic.

#### **Repotting Tips For Newer Growers**

With the Growers Clinic just around the corner, here are two tips that will go a long way towards ensuring that your newly potted plant will survive.

Your first question should be: "What Plant Should I Bring?"

In general, orchids should be repotted for two reasons. Either the plant is outgrowing the pot or there is evidence that the potting media is decomposing to the point that it interferes with proper growth. Once you've selected your orchid, consider these guidelines, some genera specific:

• Repot just as the new growth becomes evident and before the new roots appear.

Should you overlook this time point, carefully wrap a bit of sphagnum moss around the new roots to avoid damage while repotting. This holds true for most orchids with the exception of bifoliate cattleyas (pseudobulbs have two leaves), oncidiums and the catasetum alliance. Phalaenopsis orchids may be repotted at any time, even while blooming.

Bifoliate cattleyas should only be repotted after new growth has developed and new roots are just beginning. This is normally in late spring to early summer. Repotting at any other time will set them back significantly or even worse.

Oncidiums should only be reported when the new growth has progressed significantly and new roots are evident. The time lag between new growth and the appearance of new roots may be as long as six or seven months.

Catasetum alliance plants may be reported at any time they are dormant or even when new small roots are visible. The key is to withhold watering until the new roots are at least 3 to 4 inches long. Earlier watering increases the risk of root rot dramatically.

• If you recently purchased your plant from one of the big box stores, you should consider it a prime candidate for repotting. Many of the new plants are tightly packed with moss or similar material to retain moisture during shipment and time on the shelf. In most cases, these plants will appreciate being properly repotted.

Don't bring any orchid for repotting that doesn't need repotting or is not at the proper stage of development. We will have plants available at the next Raffle Table as well as at the vendor tables from Jeff Higel, Honey Bee Nursery. Jeff has promised to bring both flowering plants and plants ideally suited for repotting, as well as a selection of pots, mounts, and assorted media.

The second question should be: "What Pot/Basket should I bring?"

Bring a pot or basket that will accommodate one or two years of new growth. It's better to err on the side of a little too small as much too big.

While there are many variations, the choices are between clay pots, plastic pots (usually translucent), and baskets (either wooden or plastic).

Consider the needs of the orchid by doing a bit of research as to how the orchid grows in the wild. The AOS website is great for this and covers most genera. If the orchid grows in a tropical rain forest and receives copious amounts of rain most of the year, plastic pots are best as they retain moisture better than clay pots or baskets and permit less frequent watering while retaining sufficient moisture. Plastic pots also allow you to see the roots and more accurately assess the need for watering. On the other hand, if the orchids receive frequent heavy rainfall followed by lengthy dry spells, clay pots and baskets retain less moisture and permit the more frequent heavy watering.

If you frequently forget to water until the leaves shrivel, pot in plastic! If you obsess over the welfare of your babies and water more frequently, clay or baskets are for you.

Ask lots of questions and have a great time!
