Topic: Spotted and Splashed Cattleyas



Fred Clarke has been growing orchids for 35 years and has been hybridizing for 25 of those years. With over 28 years as a professional grower and manager in the horticultural industry, Fred applies these skills at his orchid nursery; Sunset Valley Orchids, located in San Diego, California.

He is a passionate orchid grower whose curiosity in orchids is broad and varied. Although developing Cattleya hybrids has been his sustaining interest, he is also actively creating new Australian Dendrobiums and Paphiopedilum hybrids plus some others to be named if they work out!

His pioneering work in Catasetum intergeneric hybrids led to the development of several notable hybrids, most recently the grex, Fredclarkeara After Dark, which produced "the blackest flower ever witnessed". This grex has received eight FCC's and over 41 awards worldwide.

Fred is an Accredited Judge in the Pacific South Judging Region. His plants have received hundreds of quality awards from the American Orchid Society.

Fred's topic will be "Spotted and Splashed Cattleyas". He will have plants for sale and is accepting pre-orders up to September 1st.

It is hard to believe we are into September.... Where did the summer go? Still hot and humid but we are looking forward to October, one of our favorite months, and to our "autumn" in Florida. Cooler days are coming. We are starting to look forward to our northern friends returning and to the winter orchid shows. Our orchids are in active growth and thriving with all this pure rain. Watch for fungal infections this month and consider preventative fungicide sprays to avoid problems. Some of us are still repotting (me!) but are focused on those seedlings that are ready to move up to the next pot size or those

orchids badly in need of division and repotting. Remember that the best time to repot is when the new roots are about 1" long.

We are looking forward to hosting Fred Clarke, Sunset Valley Orchids, California, on September 6th. Fred is an internationally acclaimed speaker and orchid hybridizer and one of our favorite speakers. He is famous for creating the "black orchid" Fredclarkeara After Dark and for his catasetums and interesting cattleya hybrids. His topic will be on Spotted and Splashed Cattleyas. I enjoy perusing his website late at night with a glass of wine – his descriptions of his crosses are mesmerizing! Fred will accept pre-orders until September 1st – 10% discount, no shipping fee, pick up and pay at our meeting. See order instructions at the top of page 2.

SEPTEMBER CULTURE TIP - FUNGUS CONTROL

September continues to be a hot and humid month in Venice and our plants are prone to fungus. Quaternary ammonium compounds (sold as Southern Ag SA-20, Physan 20, Consan 20 or Greenshield) are disinfectants. They can be helpful to avoid fungal infections. Follow label directions.

Preventative spraying for fungus and bacterial infections <u>is</u> effective (whereas preventative spraying of pesticides is not recommended – builds resistance). Fungicides prevent disease but do not cure it.

Disinfect your growing area monthly with SA-20/Physan or a 10% chlorox bleach solution.

August 2nd 2017 Plant Table Ribbon Awards

Attention New Members: Please bring in your blooming plants. We'd love to see them! If you have been a VAOS member for less than 2 years you just might be awarded The New Member's Ribbon!



First Place and Blue Ribbon was captured by Rick Belisle for the most multiflorous Oncidesa (Oncsa) Sweet Sugar 'Angel' ever presented at our VAOS meeting. It was registered in 1990 by M. Sato as a cross between Oncsa. Aloha Iwanaga and Gomesa varicose and it's still found under its former classification, Oncidium Sweet Sugar. It's a favorite among collectors for its flowers are larger than most yellow oncidium blooms and now Rick has proved we can all grow such a magnificent specimen here in Venice. Great growing, Rick!



Second Place and Red Ribbon was bestowed to Steve Keller for his striking orange Vanda (V.) Mokara Thai Sunspots. The 'Mokara' Vanda is a hybrid of a Ascocentrum, Arachnis and Vanda orchid and was first grown in 1969 in Singapore. Flower petals are similarly shaped as a vanda but are more star-like with reduced columns in the center. They acquire their bright color from the Vanda and the rapid growth potential from Ascocentrum. The blooms last 2-3 weeks and if grown with roots hanging they need no 're-potting' and often bloom 2x a year -- doubling our joy! Kudos to Steve!



Third Place and Yellow Ribbon was awarded to John Roche for his gorgeous Laeliocattleya (Lc.) Sayarik Wax 'Chia Lin'. Now classified as Cattlianthe (Ctt.) Sagarik Wax, it's a hybrid of C. Summerland Girl x Ctt. Chocolate Drop. John's plant had two clusters of 8-plus flowers each and 6 more clusters on the way -- such a hearty plant that he grows outdoors at his Punta Gorda ranch. If you 'have to have' this plant now, contact Palmer Orchids of Bradenton one of VAOS preeminent show vendors. Fantastic specimen John!



Members Choice Ribbon was won by Donn Smart for his Procatavola (Pcv.) Golden Peacock. Originally called Bpl. Golden Peacock, it's another wonderful hybrid of the famous Bl. Richard Mueller. (Bl. Richard Mueller is now Bc. Richard Mueller {B nodosa x C milleri} - L milleri having been reclassified as C milleri now. Whew!) The other parent is Prs. vitellina, originally Epi. vitellina, which gives this hybrid the bright orange color and the high bud count. This is still a very young plant with 6-7 flowers per stem. It will eventually produce 10-20 per stem and we'd love to see it then! Fine growing, Donn!



Best Species Ribbon was granted to Donn Smart for his precious beauty -- Habenaria (Hab.) Radiata also known as the White Egret Flower for it resembles the Snowy Egret bird. It's one of Japan's most famous terrestrial natives found in mountain bogs and moist seeps. At maturity, the plant's stalk holds 1-8 flowers, each 1&1/2 inches wide. During the summer, new bulbs will form on short underground stems while the old bulb slowly dies away. A healthy bulb can produce up to 3 replacement bulbs (!) and collectors can order the pea-size bulbs online. Congratulations, Donn!



Speaker's Choice Ribbon was given to Donn Smart for his tiny and pretty species -- Vanda (V.) (Christensonia) Vietnamica, commonly called The Vietnamese Christensonia since it is the only species of Christensonia (Chri.) It is a hot to warm growing, monopodial epiphyte with a stem of dainty flowers that are 1&1/4 inches each. It has a very pleasant sweet and fruity smell some comparing it to either orange or strawberry Pez candy. In a few years this plant can become a giant with 40-50 flowers. Thanks Donn for introducing us to one of the smallest Vandas . . . and we look forward to you turning it into a huge specimen!
