
April General Meeting

A Message from Your President

As we head into warmer temperatures, watch for thrips and scale in your collection. Thrips will ruin the flowers we wait so patiently to see bloom. Look for distorted and punctured buds and indented roots and spray with the recommended 50/50 solution of alcohol and water with a few drops of soap added. Scale is also a problem this time of year, often spreading to our orchids from palm trees or other greenery in your yard. Scale presents as "turtle shells" on the leaves or white cottony masses under the leaves or at the base of the pseudo-bulb. Segregate these plants and spray with the alcohol/water solution once every few days for several weeks until eradicated. Badly infested plants may need to be repotted. Consider using a systemic insecticide such as Orthene if you have a large collection. Systemic chemicals are longer acting but require special precautions.

We ended the 2018 show season with a bang! At the Englewood show, our exhibit took the AOS trophy, six trophies and 60 ribbons. A record number of 79 plants were entered by VAOS members – well done!

At our March 7th meeting Roy Kruger gave us an excellent Orchids 101 presentation. Our focus on the basics will continue at our April 4th meeting when Monroe Kokin will present Orchid Growing Tips for Southwest Florida. At our March 8th Growers Clinic we hosted our popular Repotting Clinic with 55 members in attendance. At our April 12th Growers Clinic we'll host our Orchid Mounting Hands on Clinic – see details in this newsletter.

As I write this, I look forward to seeing many of our members at our annual spring picnic March 25th at South Venice Yacht Club. We are hoping that many of our new members will join us so we can get to know them. Two annual events are coming up in May for the benefit of our members. On May 5th we'll host the Spring Orchid Garden Tour and on May 18th our annual bus trip to the Redland International Orchid Festival. See details in this newsletter for these events.

With 112 new members having signed up at our February show, we hope to get them off to a good start with our focus on the basics and hands-on clinics. These events provide the opportunities for all of us to meet new orchid buddies.

A LOOK BACK IN HISTORY

Here are the minutes of the very first meeting of the Venice Area Orchid Society on January 5, 1962. Dues were set a \$1 per year per family and the society met in a room at the Sarasota Federal Savings and Loan Assoc. on Venice island.

"In the absence of Mr. Thomas Fels the January 5, 1962 meeting of the Venice orchid Society was called to order by the acting chairman Mr. Cecil Duff-Stevens. There being no secretary's or treasurer's report or any old business, the chairman proceeded at once to new business. Mr. Normand Patton proposed and Mrs. James Seattle seconded a motion to appoint Mr. Fred Hohlman to the office of Treasurer. The motion carried. Mr. Patton proposed and Mrs. Attwood seconded a motion to charge nominal dues of one dollar a year a family. The motion carried. Dues were immediately collected by the treasurer from all those present. (At the next meeting it was reported that \$12.00 was in the Treasury!) Mrs. Beattie proposed and Mr. Patton seconded a motion to hold the society's meetings in the evening. The motion carried. Mrs. Patton proposed and Mr. Clark seconded a motion that the name of the society shall be "The Venice Area Orchid Society." The motion carried. Mr. Patton told us he had made inquiries and the Venice Area branch of the Sarasota Federal Savings and Loan Association can let us have a room for our meetings on the first Wednesday of each month at 7:30 P.M., an arrangement acceptable to all those present. (Our first orchid show was also on the counter of the bank!) The Chairman appointed Mr. Patton and Mrs. Beattie to present a framework of some simple by-laws at the next meeting. Mr. John Hall spoke out strongly for continuity of meetings with no summer hiatus. Mr. Hall discussed the plants on the display tables, then gave an interesting talk on diseases of orchids and showed slides which demonstrated the enormous variety and differences to be found in the members of this interesting plant family. Upon motion the meeting was adjourned. Respectfully submitted, Olivia C. Beattie, Acting Secretary."

Full Moon and Orchids by Lemon Bay

When team VAOS sets up a display during a full moon things get crazy and wonderfully strange. This display had so much color from our member's orchids it created a color blending transition that flowed wonderfully through our 100 square ft. display. The display was anchored with two tree skeletons up high in the back. Placed in the trees to the left were white Palaenopsis and Dendrobiums that flowed down the left side into lavender, pinks and purples. Placed up in the trees on the right were white Phalaenopsis and Cattleyas that flowed down the right side into the yellow and orange orchids that reached the front of the exhibit. The display center contained Paphiopedilums of different colors. Other orchid included in the display were Oncidium, Lycaste, Oconiella and Vandas.

VAOS took 2nd Place Society Display Trophy for our 100 ft. display along with the AOS Trophy for best overall display. At first this did not make sense to me, 2nd and best overall? Well the truth be told is Ken Woodward from EOAS (2nd at VAOS show) and Jack Knuese from SOS (1st at EAOS show) have very good display teams and only a few points separated our displays.

In addition to the AOS trophy, VAOS members took six trophies and 60 ribbons. Congratulations to my display team and to the 24 members who entered 79 plants to make a beautiful display.

March Growers Clinic Recap and Culture Tip

Our March Growers Clinic featured our popular Repotting Clinic. More than 55 enthusiastic members turned out to participate in the clinic, many of them new members. We made a mess but all went home happy with their repotted plants.



Many of us use time – release fertilizer (Dynamite available at Home Depot) in March and September each year to supplement our fertilizing regime. Instructions are to sprinkle it around the perimeter of the pot at the rate of 1 tsp. per 6" pot and tap down 1" into the media. The question is how to apply time – release fertilizer to a mounted plant?

One approach is the 'Bird Nest" method. Dampen a small amount of cocoanut husk fiber and shape it into a bird nest. Fill it with 1 tsp. Dynamite. Push it down into your mounted plant between the roots and the mount. This will provide up to six months fertilizer supplement to your plant.

Hands-on Mounting/Potting without Pots Clinic

Thursday, April 12, 2018

Steve Vogelhaupt and team will present a Hands-on Orchid Mounting Clinic at the Venice Community Center, Room F, at 7:00 pm. Following a short presentation and a few tips of the trade, participants will then mount their own orchid with the assistance of several experienced growers and helpers. We'll work in teams of 4 or 5 around a table with each person bringing an orchid that they plan to mount, as well as a suitable mount and a sterile pair of shears. The necessary tools and supplies, as well as coconut fiber and New Zealand sphagnum moss, will be provided.

With the exception of terrestrial orchids, almost any orchid may be mounted. Common mounts include tree fern plaques, pots, and totems; cedar and cypress slabs and driftwood that has been soaked to remove salts. If you do not have an orchid to repot, check the Raffle Table at our monthly meeting. A great selection of mounts is available at Honey Bee Nursery on Englewood Road, SR 776.

- With only two hours available and a large turnout expected, it's critical that everyone adhere to the instructions below: Only one plant per person. **All plants must have all old planting media and dead roots removed prior to the clinic.** A jet of water from a garden hose will help in removing old media. Please make sure your plant is free from pests or diseases.
- 2. This is **not** a Dividing and Repotting clinic.

Bring your problem plants and questions for expert advice from our Growers Clinic Team. Guests are welcome.

The annual **Redland International Orchid Festival** will be held in Homestead FL May 18 – 20, 2018. Snacks and water will be provided on the bus.

Departure is 7am from the Venice Community Center South Parking Lot on Friday May 18th. Plan to arrive 15 minutes early. This is the only pick up and drop off point for the event this year.

March 2018 Plant Table Awards

Attention New Members: Please bring in your blooming plants. We'd love to see them! If you have been a VAOS member for less than 2 years you just might be awarded The New Member's Ribbon!

First Place and Blue Ribbon was taken by Judy Mulligan for her perfectly round <u>Ludisia (Lus.) discolor</u> hosting 200+ flowers. Known for its velvety maroon foliage as much as its blooms, *Ludisia* is an orchid genus of just one species, *Ludisia discolor*, referred to as the 'jewel orchid'. As a native terrestrial it thrives on the forest floor in southern China and east Asia. Judy has had this robust plant for 4 years having divided it several times; she grows it in dirt like an African violet and it blooms several times a year!! Great cultivation practices, Judy!

Second Place and Red Ribbon was won by Judy Chisholm for her striking <u>Laeliocattleya (Lc.) Mildred</u> <u>Rives 'Orchidglade' FCC/AOS</u> with the lovely white picotee ruffle on the lip. FCC means it was awarded First Class Certificate by the American Orchid Society – that is the flower scored over 90 points on a scale of 100 and indicates an extremely high-quality plant. Keep an eye out for other hearty FCC plants as you build up your collection. Beautiful job, Judy!





Third Place and Yellow Ribbon was granted to Kate Burda for her delightful beauty, Brassolaeliocattleya (Blc.) Windward Flare, a cross of B. Nodosa and Lc. Memoria Robert Strait and registered in 2003 by A. Buckman. B. Nodosa, a favorite choice gives it the lovely large lip and Lc. Memoria donates its beautiful dark red color which becomes an entrancing dreamy pastel pink on its lip. Wonderful growing, Kate! **Best Species and Purple Ribbon** was presented to Donn Smart for his Dendrobium (Den.) aggregatum a lovely compact-growing species with more than 10 pendulous sprays of many 1.5" lovely lemon-yellow flowers. Most growers give it a winter rest, without watering, to stimulate producing spring blooms. Donn continues watering but also ensures it receives good sun exposure. Due to its flowing flowers, it's an orchid collector's favorite. Exquisite specimen, Donn!





New Member Grower and Pink Ribbon was awarded to Ken and Stephanie Luberger for their stately Brassidium (Brsdm.) Shooting Star 'Black Gold'. The flowers last approximately six weeks and are a show stopper. The Brassidum is a hybrid of a Brassia species, from which it gets its 'spidery' look, and the rest from an oncidium. The Lubergers found this gem at Lowes which often has bargains. A Brassidium thrives if it is treated grown like an oncidium. Splendid job, Ken and Stephanie! We're glad you joined VAOS.

Members' Choice and Green Ribbon was won by Debi Wolfe for her enticing dark red Brassolaelio cattleya (Blc.) Eagle Island 'Sangria'. This hybrid is Blc. Memoria Ralph Placentia x Blc Oconee, registered in 1987 by Carter and Holmes. When exhibited in the 1992 Atlanta Orchid Show it earned an AM/ AOS award and now 'Sangria' has been cloned and distributed to hobbyists across the world. It's a robust plant to add to your collection. Way to go, Debi!





Speaker's Choice and White Ribbon was given to Donn Smart for his lovely <u>Lysudamuloa (Lys.) Red</u> <u>Jewel</u> a hybrid of (Lycamerlycaste Geyser Gold x Angulocaste Red Jade) registered by Wang in 2010. The plant has exquisite russet-red flowers with a burgundy lip surrounded by yellow and often exudes a pleasing watermelon aroma. Donn grows it in his shade house, watering it later in the day, and under fans to keep the humid Florida air moving. It's a most enchanting orchid to own. Thanks for bringing it in,
