Miranda Orchids started in 1999 and is a nursery specializing in growing mainly selected Cattleya alliance species. In a sense, it is a continuation of Boa Vista Orchids, a nursery we ran in Brazil from 1986 until we moved to the U.S.A. Many of the plants available are produced in our lab and nursery in Central Florida from our extensive collection of stud plants. The rest we bring from Brazil to increase variety and novelty. Being native Brazilians, and having had a nursery for many years, we know that there is a lot of development in Cattleya species being done there. This is mostly because a lot of those species are native from Brazil (including all the bifoliate cattleyas) and because these plants are favorites of growers there. Of course having lived and grown orchids for a long time there we know most of the growers and what is being produced and we go there several times a year to make sure we are kept upto-date. Miranda Orchids also grows other Brazilian species so if you are looking for something in particular do not hesitate in contact us. Our goal is to be your number one source for selected Brazilian Orchids.

A taxonomist, naturalist and orchid grower, Francisco travels extensively in the U.S. and internationally speaking at orchid-related events and meetings. He has been doing this since 1988, while still living in Brazil. The subjects of these presentations reflect Francisco's extensive travels to study orchids in their natural environments.

Miranda Orchids is located between Orlando and Tampa, on the I-4 corridor. He will have a nice selection of orchids for sale.

Our first orchid show of the season, the annual Sarasota Orchid Society (SOS) Show and Sale. Show hours are Saturday 9am - 5pm and Sunday 10am -5pm. Setup is Friday, January 4th, 2018, 9am - 4pm.

Your blooming plants are needed to create our display. We will collect and transport your plants to the show and ensure their safe return to you on Monday following the show. Bring your plants to one of two locations by Thursday January 3th, 6pm:

South Venice: Carol Wood, 4941 Bella Terra Dr., Venice (Venetia), 497-4995 (Leave on front porch)

Venice Island: Bruce Weaver, 328 West Bay Dr., Venice, 800-7804 (leave by front door)

Or bring them to the Sarasota Municipal Auditorium on Friday January 4th at 9am

All plants must be registered in advance via email by Wednesday, January 2nd, 8pm:

Email your plant name with a photo or bloom size and color description to PlantReg@VAOS.org.

Plants should be cleaned, staked, free of pests and disease and labeled with both the plant name and the owner's name. Flowers should be in prime condition to last through the weekend show. Please water your plants thoroughly and place in a box or container for transport to the show.

We need help transporting plants and with display set up on Friday and take down on Sunday. If you can help, please contact Jay Loeffler at 485-9569

Preparing Your Orchid for the Show Exhibit

If your really nice plants are in full bloom during the show weekend, you may want to consider entering it into the VAOS display exhibit or exhibiting the plant individually for a potential award.

Identify Your Plant: To make sure your plant is properly labeled and to make sure you get your plant back after the show, some helpful steps are necessary.

PLANTS MUST BE REGISTERED IN AVANCE BY EMAIL: PlantReg@VAOS.org. Email your plant name with a photo or flower color description and flower size (larger or smaller than 5"). The Plant Register will send you a number to identify your plant. You should mark your pot with this number and your name, with masking tape and a Sharpie pen.

Groom Your Plant: You should remove dead or brown leaves and pseudobulbs from the plant. Make sure it is insect and disease free. Clean the leaves with a mildly acidic solution like white vinegar, lemon juice, Sprite, 7 Up, etc to remove calcium build up or other spotting. Remove trash, debris, stems and weeds from the pot. Stake the inflorescence to show the flower to its best advantage.

Getting Your Plant to the Show: If you are can't bring your plants to the setup of the display, arrangements will be made to transport your plant to the show. In either case, secure your plant in a carry box with newspapers to hold the plant stationary. The plants must be ready no later than the day before set up.

	Checklist: To follow for preparing your plants.					
		Clean the pseudobulbs and leaves (water helps to soften the dry papery sheath coverings around mature pseudobulbs so that you can gently rub it off).				
		Make sure the media in the container is clean and free of weeds.				
		Wipe the top of the leaves (vinegar, lemon juice, sprite, 7 up, diluted milk, etc.) to remove residue. Do not use commercial spray to shine the leaves, it is not good for the plant or judging				
		Carefully inspect plant for pests and if any are found remove them with alcohol and a Q tip. If there is a bad infestation, do not bring the plant to the show.				
		Inspect the flowers for thrips and other damage. If a flower is marred by the spots, it is better to leave the plant at home.				
		Carefully stake the inflorescence if this will help present the flowers to their best advantage. If you can plan ahead of time it is best to train the inflorescence as it emerges and is soft, a mature inflorescence is hardened off and can break easily.				
		Remove any wire hangers, hoops, etc and water each plant thoroughly before bringing to the show.

Grower Clinic Culture Tips, Recap and Upcoming Clinic

November Growers Clinic Recap

Jim Thomas and Jay Loeffler gave an excellent presentation on Protecting Your Orchids in Cold Weather. Here are some general guidelines they presented:

- -Phalaenopsis. need temperatures down to 50-60* to initiate flower spikes
- -Cimbidiums benefit from temperatures down to the 40*'s to initiate flower spikes
- -Reduce watering during the winter months.
- Vandas are sensitive to temps below 60*
- -Phalaenopsis-type dendrobiums are sensitive to temps below 60*
- -Other dendrobiums enjoy nighttime temps in the 50*'s
- -Cattleyas don't mind cooler temps into the 50*'s and mature plants can tolerate down to 35* nighttime temps.

November 2018 Meeting Plant Table Awards

First Place and Blue Ribbon was presented to *Jeff Higel* for his stunning orange Vanda (V) phairot x V. Yip Sum Wah with 3 inflorescences of multiple blooms, the third inflorescence not seen in the photo, being on the backside. In addition to the flowers, the roots were more than 6 feet long attesting to Jeff's meticulous routine watering and fertilizing, not unexpected of a master



professional grower at Honey Bee Nursery, Englewood. Last month Jeff also took an award for his Vanda. Always quality plants, congratulations Jeff!!



Second Place and Red Ribbon won by *Donn Smart* for his Paphiopedilum (Paph.) Parishii x Paph. Lowii with four graceful blooms -- a lovely mixture of red, yellow and brown. Donn grows this plant in a filled-up shade house he built, equipped with an overhead water/fertilizing system and fans to keep the air moving. He constructed rolled-up plastic curtains on the sides to protect his plants from the cold weather. Last month, this very plant was awarded at the Florida West Coast Orchid Show, as the 'Best Paphiopedilum Hybrid'. A talented grower -- Donn!

Third Place and Yellow Ribbon was awarded to Steve Keller for his striking red beauty, Brassolaeliocattleya (Blc.) NOID, or No Identification tag. At the Growers Clinic we saw examples of our member's growing areas. We found that the easiest way to grow our orchids is in a pool cage (providing 70% light) having natural air circulation that dries out the plant quickly after the rains. Another advantage is that the sunshine graces the plants from all sides so they grow straight up, elegantly. Steve has such a pool garden. Wonderful growing, Steve!



November 2018 Meeting Plant Table Awards Continued....

Both Best Species and Member's Choice Ribbons were awarded to *Barry Reese* for his showy pink Cattleya (C.) trianae 'Esperanza Mejia' This plant overwhelmed our huge plant table with at least 23 huge blooms. This beautiful species is from Colombia's rain forest, across all 3 cordillas (mountain chains) and is their national flower. It was selected for this prestigious position because it has the same colors as the Colombian flag – red, blue and yellow, with the petals and sepals the more lavender. A magnificent specimen— double congratulations to Barry!





New Member Grower's Ribbon was given to Deborah Magliolo for her delightful Psychopsis (Pyp.) mendenhall, called the 'Butterfly Orchid'. Psychopsis means "soul" in Latin and it's named after the goddess Psyche -- the wife of Eros, who had butterfly wings! When the wind blows, the flower waves like butterflies, and bees think this is an aggressive act, so they 'attack' the flower, transporting pollinia. This orchid species surprised European botanists so much, that psychopis mania began soon after its discovery. They hail from Trinidad, Central and S. America and are beloved in part because they're almost always in bloom as hearty sequential bloomers. Great job, Deborah!

Speaker's Choice Ribbon was granted to *Donn Smart* for his gorgeous deep purple-black Fredclarkeara (Fdk.) After Dark SVO 'Black Pearl' FCC/AOS. No wonder Donn received this award – Fred Clarke, from Sun Valley Orchids in CA, was our speaker that night – one who would deeply appreciate this special plant. Fred's pioneering work in Catasetum intergeneric hybrids led to the development of several notable hybrids, most recently this grex, Fredclarkeara After Dark, which produces "the blackest flower ever witnessed" according to judging experts. It has received eight



FCCs and more than 50 awards worldwide and Donn's plant is raised to this level. Gorgeous specimen, Donn!
