Roy has been growing orchids for over 15 years. When he moved to Florida, he bought a house and inherited three plants left by the previous owner. He soon found that orchids multiply faster than



rabbits and today his collection is over 500 plants. His favorites are Cattleya species and unusual Dendrobiums. He is a hobbyist grower and not a commercial reseller. Most of his collection is grown outdoors year-round. He grows in a pool cage, under an arbor, attached to trees and anywhere along the fence that the squirrels can't reach.

Roy has served 12 years as President of Manatee Orchid Society and eight years as Program VP with the Sarasota Orchid Society. He teaches a series of culture classes to various societies and authors a monthly article entitled "Orchids We Should All Grow" that appears in numerous newsletters. He has spoken to numerous societies and clubs throughout western Florida and we are fortunate to have him come again to give his talk. He is quite a dynamic speaker and one you don't want to miss. Roy's topic is "Orchids 101", a basic culture presentation that will appeal to our many new members.

February Growers Clinic Hands-on Orchid Repotting Clinic



Thursday, February 14th, Venice Community Center Room F, 7pm

Joanna Shaw and the Growers Clinic team will lead a Hands-on Orchid Repotting session at the Venice Community Center at 7:00 p.m. They will explain the supplies, tools and planting media, demonstrate basic procedures and share their tips of the trade. Participants will then repot their own orchid with the assistance of several experienced growers and helpers. We will work in teams of 4 or 5 around a table with each person bringing an orchid that needs repotting as well as a suitable pot to replant the orchid and a sterile pair of shears.

With only two hours available and a large turnout expected, it is critical that everyone adhere to the instructions below:

- All plants must be removed from their pot and all old planting media and dead roots must be removed prior to the clinic
- Only one plant per person
- Bring your pot and shears
- Please make sure your plant is free from pests or diseases.

Media and supplies for most orchids will be provided.

Bring your problem plants for expert help. Guests are welcome. Park on the left side of the building and enter Room F at the side entrance.

Note: Attendees are requested not to wear perfume as this is a small room and many of our members have allergies. Thank you.

February Culture Tip - Winter Watering

It may be frigid up North but it sure is nice here in Venice! In spite of some cold nights, our daytime temperatures remain comfortable. While reduced watering in winter is recommended, it warrants monitoring your plants' needs and adjusting your watering routine as needed. Learn the "heft test" – lift your pot and get to know when it is heavy or light, in need of watering. Or master the finger/pencil/skewer stick test – inserted in the media to detect moisture level. New growth pseudobulbs should be fat and plump. Water thoroughly when you water and then water again in 15 minutes.

VAOS ANNUAL SHOW INSTRUCTIONS FOR SHOW VOLUNTEERS

Thank you for volunteering for our annual show!

- All volunteers must enter through the rear door. A volunteer by the kitchen will verify your assignment from our list and provide directions. Pick up your nametag there and then pick up your t-shirt at the membership table before you report to your work location.
- Volunteers are requested to park at the back of parking lots on both sides of building. No parking is permitted behind the building – loading and unloading only.
- All show volunteers receive a show t-shirt and free admission to the show.
 Food donations should also be brought in through the rear door by 11am each day. Those members receive free admission to the show. All others must enter through the front door Saturday and Sunday and pay admission.

The Venice Community Center has strict rules regarding loading and unloading. All show participants may use only the three rear steel doors for loading and unloading – no exceptions! Nothing may be brought in through the lobby or the side glass doors.

- All communications with the VCC staff and our show vendors should be through Carol, Judy or Ed Soentgen (to avoid any miscommunications).
- Your committee chair will have instructions for your assignment when you arrive. Please review them.
- Show attendees are our guests and we are famous for our army of friendly volunteers. Greet our guests with a smile!

PLANT REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

Our annual show is here and Jay Loeffler and his team need your blooming plants to create a winning display. Our show will be held at the Venice Community Center on February 2-3 with set up on Friday, February 1st.

Please bring your blooming plants to the community center on Friday, February 1st between 9am and 11am. Enter through the rear door. Plants will be staged in Room G, down the hall to your left.

Alternatively, you may drop off your plants at one of two locations by Thursday January 31st, noon:

 (Leave on front porch)
- Venice Island: Bruce Weaver, 328 West Bay Dr., Venice, 800-7804 (leave by front door)

All plants must be registered in advance via email on Tuesday – Wednesday, January 29 – 30. Late entries will be accepted up to Thursday at noon.

Plants should be cleaned, staked, and free of pests and disease and labeled with both the plant name and the owner's name. Please water your plant thoroughly and write your last name on the pot.

Your Blooming Plants Are Needed!

EAOS PRESENTS "Orchids by Lemon Bay" March 1-2, 2019

Members make it possible for us to participate in orchid shows. We would not be able to build our wonderful displays if our members did not grow beautiful orchids and allow them to be shown. Your blooming plants are needed to create our display.

Show: Friday March 1st & Saturday March 2nd - 10am - 5pm

Take Down: Saturday March 2nd – 5pm

Bring your plants to the EAOS Show site on Thursday morning at 10am. If you are unable to bring your plants to Englewood, you may bring them to Carol Wood's home for transport:

PLANTS MUST BE REGISTERED IN AVANCE BY EMAIL TO <u>PlantReg@VAOS.org</u> on Monday - Tuesday, February 25-26. Late registration will be accepted up until Wednesday, February 27th at noon. Email your plant name with a photo or flower color description and flower size (larger or smaller than 5"). Place a piece of tape on your pot with your last name.

Plants should be cleaned, staked, free of pests and disease and in prime condition to last through the show. Please water your plants thoroughly before the show.

Pick up your plants Saturday evening at the show at 5pm, following display take down.

Preparing Your Orchid for the Show Exhibits

If your really nice plants are in full bloom during the show weekend, you may want to consider entering it into the VAOS display exhibit or exhibiting the plant individually for a potential award.

Identify Your Plant: To make sure your plant is properly labeled and to make sure you get your plant back after the show, some helpful steps are necessary.

PLANTS MUST BE REGISTERED IN AVANCE BY EMAIL: PlantReg@VAOS.org. Email your plant name with a photo or flower color description and flower size (larger or smaller than 5"). The Plant Register will send you a number to identify your plant. You should mark your pot with this number and your name, with masking tape and a Sharpie pen.

Groom Your Plant: You should remove dead or brown leaves and pseudobulbs from the plant. Make sure it is insect and disease free. Clean the leaves with a mildly acidic solution like white vinegar, lemon juice, Sprite, 7 Up, etc to remove calcium build up or other spotting. Remove trash, debris, stems and weeds from the pot. Stake the inflorescence to show the flower to its best advantage.

Getting Your Plant to the Show: If you are can't bring your plants to the setup of the display, arrangements will be made to transport your plant to the show. In either case, secure your plant in a carry box with newspapers to hold the plant stationary. The plants must be ready no later than the day before set up.

	Checklist: To follow for preparing your plants.			
		Clean the pseudobulbs and leaves (water helps to soften the dry papery sheath coverings around mature pseudobulbs so that you can gently rub it off).		
		Make sure the media in the container is clean and free of weeds.		
		Wipe the top of the leaves (vinegar, lemon juice, sprite, 7 up, diluted milk, etc.) to remove residue. Do not use commercial spray to shine the leaves, it is not good for the plant or judging		
		Carefully inspect plant for pests and if any are found remove them with alcohol and a Q tip. If there is a bad infestation, do not bring the plant to the show.		
		Inspect the flowers for thrips and other damage. If a flower is marred by the spots, it is better to leave the plant at home.		
		Carefully stake the inflorescence if this will help present the flowers to their best advantage. If you can plan ahead of time it is best to train the inflorescence as it emerges and is soft, a mature inflorescence is hardened off and can break easily.		
		Remove any wire hangers, hoops, etc and water each plant thoroughly before bringing to the show.

January 2019 Meeting Plant Table Awards

First Place and Blue Ribbon was captured by Donn Smart for his gorgeous Dendrobium (Den.) Isabel Sander (dearei x sanderae) with its showy white clusters of flowers. Den. dearei is a fragrant native species of Indonesia and is also found in the northern part of the Philippines where it grows as an epiphyte on the pine trees of the forest. Donn uses a medium that is 70% organic -- sponge rock and charcoal. He waters and feeds it daily with his Vandas, hence it has been blooming continually for 2 years! Beautiful specimen, Donn!

Second Place and Red Ribbon was awarded to Ed Murphy for his beautiful Rlc. Memoria Kimi Nowak (C. Horace x Rlc.Golden Regal). It had 4 stupendous blooms. Ed, a new VAOS member, started growing orchids in 2014. He bought this plant on EBAY from a reputable hybridizer. He attributes its hardiness to the following: He grows it in a pool cage with an extra mesh cloth above; he uses reverse osmosis water (rather than well water which often becomes salty in the softening process) and he fertilizes weakly (1.4 T/gal) every 2-3 days in the summer and fewer times in the winter. His media is 30% Orchiata mixed with



inorganic elements with Styrofoam at the bottom of clay pots for easy draining. Great job, Ed!



Third Place and Yellow Ribbon was granted to Natasha Romero Contreras for her gorgeous Paphiopedilum. Since she was unsure of its name, I asked Facebook colleagues at Florida Orchid Growing for help. Prem Subrahmanyam (www.FLNativeOrchid.com), who has addressed VAOS several times, suggested it was P. spicerianum alba ('alba' means pure white, green or yellow -green). Another FOG member said that if it is not P. spicerianum, it surely is a hybrid of it. I think the triangular dorsal sepal is a dead give-away bringing majesty to the bloom. Natasha grows it under a pergola with side trellis and top black screen in the open air. She switched to reverse osmosis water instead of

odorous well water which killed former plants. She says she also regularly talks to her plants. Nice growing, Natasha!

Best Species and Purple Ribbon was presented to Donn Smart for his striking red Dendrobium (Den.) bractosum. This species is native to New Guinea and grows at an altitude of 65 to 1300 feet either on the forest trees or along the rivers and coast on mangrove trees in lowland rainforests. This Bracted Dendrobium has flowers which are extremely long-lasting up to 5-6 months and as the lower ones die, more grow up the pseudobulbs. Donn says that this plant, also, has been in bloom for 2 years as he waters it daily with his Vandas. Charming specimen and presentation, Donn!





Both Members' Choice and Speaker's Choice was awarded to Donn Smart for his unusual Green-yellow Catasetum, Ctsm. viridiflavum, a species from the West Indies, Mexico, and Central America down into Argentina. Notice his plant has the more attractive 'male flowers', or perhaps the flowers are a combo of male and female, according to Jeff Higel, orchid grower at Honeybee Nursery, Englewood. Knowing that catesetums are heavy feeders, Donn feeds it daily or more in the summer growing season along with his Vandas, and when the leaves start yellowing, he gives it less water. Thanks for bringing in such a unique orchid, Donn!
