VAOS DISPLAY TAKES FIRST PLACE AT SARASOTA ORCHID SHOW!



Congratulations to Bruce Weaver and TEAM VAOS for taking First Place Society Display at the annual Sarasota Orchid Society (SOS) Show and Sale January 4-5. Four displays exhibited at the SOS show. SOS exhibit took 2nd place, Englewood exhibit took 3rd and the commercial vendor exhibit took the AOS trophy.

JANUARY GROWERS CLINIC

Last month's Growers Clinic was "Growing Vandas in South Florida", presented by Naoki Kawamura. Naoki explained the four types of Vandas by different leaf shapes. He then explained the cultural requirements needed for successful growing, giving temperature and humidity requirements. He then gave us his formulas for his fertilizer mixes.

Naoki explained the different ways he had to adapt from growing in Portland, OR. to how he now grows in Venice FL. It was a very nice visual presentation on how we need to adapt to our own growing conditions.

When he showed his AOS awarded plants (eight in one year 2019) everyone felt as they now had more information to grow Vandas successfully and enjoy



them as well. Naoki finished the presentation with a raffle where he gave away three large and wonderfully grown Vandas from his collection. It was a great clinic to start the New Year that everyone enjoyed.

VAOS ANNUAL SHOW INSTRUCTIONS FOR ALL SHOW VOLUNTEERS

Thank you for volunteering for our annual show!

All volunteers must enter through the rear door. A volunteer by the kitchen will verify your assignment from our list and provide directions. Pick up your nametag there and then pick up your t-shirt at the membership table before you report to your work location.

Volunteers are requested to park at the back of parking lots on both sides of building. No parking is permitted behind the building – loading and unloading only.

All show volunteers receive a show t-shirt and free admission to the show. Food donations should also be brought in through the rear door by 11am each day. Those members receive free admission to the show. All others must enter through the front door Saturday and Sunday and pay admission.

The Venice Community Center has strict rules regarding loading and unloading. All show participants may use only the three rear steel doors for loading and unloading – no exceptions! Nothing may be brought in through the lobby or the side glass doors.

All communications with the VCC staff and our show vendors should be through Carol, Judy or Ed Soentgen (to avoid any miscommunications)

Your committee chair will have instructions for your assignment when you arrive. Please review them.

January 2020 Meeting Plant Table Awards

First Place and Blue Ribbon was presented to Donna Yurgil for her gorgeous Brassolaeliocattleya (Blc) Hawaiian Effect 'Fred Schull', now officially called, Rhyncholaeliocattleya (Rlc.). It's a cross of C. Horace 'Maxima' x Rlc. Mahina Yahiro 'Ullii' and was registered in 2001 by Kodama Orchids.

Hawaii. Donna has had this plant for two years and has done a beautiful job of cultivating it well – producing 7 spectacular lavender/reddish show-stopping flowers! Congratulations, Donna for cultivating such a large, hearty specimen!

Second Place, Members' Choice and Speaker's Choice Ribbons were all won by Jerry Daenzer for his spectacular Brassolaeliocattleya (Blc.) Booth Lee 'Venice' having at least 60 lush fuschia blooms. This plant also received a Blue Ribbon at last week's Sarasota Show. It's a hybrid of Bc. Maikai (B. nodosa x C. bowringiana) x Lc. Jalapa (C. guttata x L. milleri). The hybrid was registered by T.W. Moore, California in 2001. Due to its beauty



and rapacious growth, it's grown by many of our VAOS members. Just 2 years ago, Jerry divided his huge plant into 4 divisions – and this is the result from just one of them. Kudos to you, Jerry, for all your ribbons -- but especially for your talent!



Third Place and Yellow Ribbon was bestowed to Jerry Daenzer for his Dendrobium (Den.) Green Elf. It's considered a 'primary hybrid' because it's a cross between 2 species, Den. alexandrae x Den. convolutum. Jerry's plant had 10+ spikes with 40+ exotic flowers – star shaped with yellow-green petals and sepals and with a striking v-shaped purple lip. This hybrid was registered by H&R Nurserv. HI in 2001. It also has been crossed with

Den. convolutum again to produce Den. Green Apples, very similar looking to Green Elf, and available at Palmer's Orchids locally. Great growing, Jerry, to have produced such a robust specimen!

January Plant Table Awards, Continued...



Best Species Ribbon was awarded to Donn Smart for his Masdevallia (Masd.) Mary Staal with its delicate yellow blooms on a sturdy compact plant. It's a hybrid of the species Masd. coccinea x the hybrid Masd. Angel Frost, a cross of 2 other species. Colombians refer to Masd. coccinea as 'La Bandito' or 'little flag' which is so cute and helps form the flower! Most Masdevallia species grow at high altitudes up to 5,000 in the mountains of Colombia and Peru. Since they prefer a cool, moist location, they still require good light to flower consistently. Donn grows them in his 'Cool Shade House' and runs his AC in the summer. He says

they love lots of water! Thanks, Donn, for encouraging us to grow 'cool' orchids!

New Member Grower's Ribbon was won by Maria Ruano for her gorgeous Wilsonara (Wils.) Rioja 'Red Hot'. It's a recent hybrid (Onc. Queen Ingmar x Ons. Catatante) having been registered in 2014 by Mauna Kea Orchids. Now it's been reclassified into a new genus and is officially Oncostele (Ons.) Rioja 'Red Hot'. It's important to keep a plant's tag attached to the plant, for it tells the history of its making, a family tree, so to speak. With this history, we can better research and sort out its cultural needs. Maria grows her



orchids in her open lanai facing the East to catch the morning sun rays. After a plant blooms, she moves it closer to the house; then she moves the next upcoming bloomer closer to the sun. Maria also won 2 ribbons at our November 2019 meeting which should encourage other "New Members", less than 2 years at VAOS, to bravely bring in their orchids! Great job, again, Maria!

Thank you to everyone who brought their orchids to share!
