Topic: Vandas



I have been growing orchids for a little over 20 years. After my friend bought a house, I asked her what she wanted for a house warming gift. She said a white Phalaenopsis and mentioned a boutique orchid store in Portland, Oregon. I visited the store, and was overwhelmed with the variety of orchids, especially multi-growths Paphiopedilum micranthum, which price tag was \$800. I just walked away with a white Phalaenopsis.

A couple days later, I went back to the store and got myself a Dendrobium. As I tried to learn how to take care of it, I read a couple books. I also joined the Oregon Orchid Society to learn more from other growers.

Although I could not buy the Paphiopedilum micranthum, I acquired my first green Paphiopedilum at the society meeting. As I visited the monthly meeting, I brought more orchids home from local vendors/speakers. All of a sudden, my dining table became an orchid table. Due to cold weather in winter, all orchids were grown under lights. They responded to the environment well, and I was able to rebloom them.

When we moved to a new house in 2003, our small garage was converted to an orchid growing area. We had over 100 Paphiopedilums and Phragmipediums which were grown under 4 units of 400 watt metal halid lights. All the orchids stayed inside all year long. What I didn't understand was the effect of light spectrum. They seemed to have grown, but not many bloomed.

While I was struggling to rebloom *Paphiopedilums* and *Phragmipediums*, I read a blog on Orchid Board about a lady in Michigan growing *Vandas* under lights successfully in her basement. I drew a design of the structure and built it out of PVC pipes. That was the beginning of my *Vanda* growing in Oregon. As my *Vanda* collection started growing, I started selling my *Paphiopedilums and Phragmipediums*. I believe that was when Facebook became popular and I met several orchid friends from Florida through Facebook. A trip to the Tamiami International Orchid Festival and the Redland International Orchid show became our annual vacation.

Relocating to Florida was our life-long dream and it became true when I accepted a National Sales Support Manager position in April, 2016. Why Venice? We never visited Venice before, but thanks to John Masters and his friend/realtor, we managed to purchase the house without walking through it. My orchid collection was shipped to a friend in Orlando and he had helped them get acclimated to Florida sun.

All my orchids are grown inside the pool cage. This is a completely different environment than I was used to in Portland Oregon. Little did I know that it gets cold here for Vandas. I love new challenges and strive to learn more to grow better. Thanks to the Florida North Central Judging Center, I received 24 American Orchid Society awards in 2021: 7 HCCs, 14 AMs, 1 FCCs, 1 CCM and 1 CHM.

February Meeting Plant Table Awards

First Place Blue Ribbon was awarded to Gunther Lobisch for his gorgeous Ryncholaeliocattleya (Rlc.) Dick Smith Paradise 'Dark Splash' (Rlc. Hisako Akatsuka X Rlc. Hawaiian Lightning). What a stand-out with 15+ flowers! This cattleya hybrid has everything – large frilly yellow flowers with defined magenta flares and some picotee edging on both petals and lip. It's fragrant too! It is a consistent bloomer and even in its first bloom stage it will produce 2-3 buds. The flowers, about 3.5" in size, will multiply yearly and its coloration makes it a must-have for hobbyists. Yet, many growers say they are currently 'out of stock' of this plant so begin your search in a few months. Congratulations, Gunther for your fine specimen!



Second Place Red Ribbon and Speaker's Choice White Ribbon was presented to Bob Milner for his striking yellow Rhyncattleanthe (Rth.) Elizabeth Palmer. This orchid hybrid was originated in 1998 by R.H. Palmer, a well-known grower and hybridizer located in Bradenton and it's one of Palmer's own crosses (Rth. Orange Nuggett x Rth. Twenty-four Carat). The blooms are golden yellow progressing to orange with age and a faint red picotee marks the perimeter of the petals and the lip. Because it is a Palmer orchid mericlone, you can know that upon purchase you'll receive an exact replica of this plant and flower colorations. Congratulations Bob for your exquisite cultivation!

February 2022 Meeting Plant Table Awards Continued



Third Place Yellow Ribbon was awarded to Rick Belisle for his lovely Clowesia (Cl.) Rebecca Northen 'Grapefruit Pink' **-- a famous plant having beautiful frilly pink flowers with an intoxicating citrus scent on multiple pendant inflorescences. Here Rick describes his journey of growing Catasetums (slightly edited): "I never HEARD of Catasetums, Cynoches or Clowesia before speaking with Vicki Fisher. I bought a couple of them from Fred Clarke, Sun Valley Orchids, after hearing his presentation. I followed his and Vicki's suggestions, and the darn thing bloomed!! I now have 11 Catasetums of which this Clowesia is one of them. It has bloomed twice for me and has won 2 yellow ribbons. Catasetum orchids are very intriguing. Growing them is not necessarily challenging, but requires a slightly different "learning path" that's fun and rewarding. I grow them in a media of 50/50 LECA and Coconut Husk. In the Spring, after they come out of their "winter rest", when their new roots are 5"-6" long, almost daily water and feeding, bright light, and they grow like mad! At Halloween, reduce watering and feeding to 1-2X a week. After Thanksgiving or when all the leaves have turned brown or fallen off, no water or food and unpot them, put them, with the tags attached, in a bucket in the garage, and check them, weekly, for new growth/roots. When the new roots/ growth starts, repot them and give them a little more light, but no food or water! When the roots are 5-6" long, move them to bright light and begin the almost daily watering and feeding process again." Thanks for your growing tips, Rick, and many congratulations!!



Behind the Scenes of the VAOS



The Venice Area Orchid Society has always been blessed by a group of wonderful volunteers willing to help with all the little things that make us successful. This month the focus is on Rick Belisle. Rick joined the VAOS about 13 years ago. He has about 100 orchids, mostly dendrobiums and catasetums. show attendees along with Jimmy Thomas. We are quite fortunate that Rick has now agreed to become our Director of Education and Training and he will coordinate our Grower's Clinic schedule. At our next Grower's Clinic on March 10th, he will do his Orchids 101 presentation.

Rick is originally from Rhode Island and has lived in Pittsburg and Wisconsin. Rick is retired and is a full time Floridian. For many years he worked for Johnson Wax selling building maintenance products. He also got to travel internationally doing training for new computer systems dealing with Customer Relations Management. March Culture Tip

March is the month to apply time release fertilizer to your orchids. We recommend Dynamite, in the red canister, found in Home Depot's garden shop. Apply at the rate of 1 tsp. per 6" pot, sprinkling it around the perimeter of the pot and tapping it down 1" into the media. It provides a small amount of fertilizer each time you water, supplementing your regular fertilizing regime. It lasts about six months when you can apply it again in September.


