We have the pleasure of having Arthur E. Chadwick of Chadwick & Son Orchids from Richmond, Virginia speak to our Society on April 6th, His topic is "Large Flowered Cattleya Species".

Chadwick & Son was founded in 1989, and is Richmond's premier orchid supplier. Arthur's father, Arthur A. Chadwick, was legendary in the orchid world and had been growing orchids since 1943. He and his son co-authored The Classic Cattleyas on large-flowered Cattleya species. Martha Stewart favorably reviewed the book and both Chadwick's on her television show where they presented Martha with an orchid named after her ... C. Martha Stewart. The Chadwick's have named Cattleya hybrids after the wives of many U.S. Presidents and have personally presented the flowers to many of the recipients.

Arthur is near completion of another new book, "First Ladies and their Cattleyas: A Century of Namesake Orchids" which is the much anticipated sequel to "The Classic Cattleyas", now in its second printing. Also written by the father/son team, the book explores the 100+ year history of United States First Ladies and the cattleya hybrids that bear their names.

The lineage of these plants provides an overview of the diverse family of cattleya species that exist in nature as well as an inside look at the renowned growers around the world who played a role in creating these enduring legacies. Also included are the fascinating stories of the actual flower presentations, many of which involved the Chadwick's.

Chadwick Orchids consists of 11 greenhouses and now includes his father's extensive collection of heritage orchids, including many very hard to find Cattleya hybrids and species.

Behind the Scenes of the VAOS



The Venice Area Orchid Society has always been blessed by a group of wonderful volunteers willing to help with all the little things that make us successful. Each month, I will focus on a different member and give you some background about them. My hope is that this will give us all an opportunity to get to know each other a little better.

This month the focus is Cynthia Vance. You may currently recognize her as the woman taking photos of the plant table winners for the newsletter, however Cynthia's involvement with the orchid society goes way back and is really quite significant.

Cynthia moved to Venice and joined the orchid society in 2009. When she joined, president Ted Kellogg was looking for a volunteer to help him set up programming and schedule speakers. Cynthia did the programming for several years and then served a 4-year term as president.

During her term as president, Cynthia used her organizational planning background to implement some pretty significant changes:

The first detailed line item budget was created, a format we still use.

Also at the time, Barbara Wagner was chairing the annual show, Cynthia and Carol Wood worked with Barbara to create a timeline/project plan that could be repeated from one year to the next to get our annual show up and running.

Cynthia also expanded the board positions, helping define several new positions so that the work of running the society could be distributed to more people. She created a specific board meeting agenda format to keep board meetings focused.

She worked with Peggy Fahrenback who initiated the mentoring program for new members.

Cynthia planned the celebration of the 50th Anniversary of the Venice Area Orchid Society, the mayor of Venice attended and Peggy went through the old archives and photographs and created a fascinating display.

Since stepping down as president several years ago, each year Cynthia has worked with Sue Grimmer on fundraising and getting sponsorship for our show. This has allowed us to significantly increase the funds we keep on reserve. Cynthia says Ted told her we should set a goal to keep one year's expenses worth of extra funds in reserve in the event there was ever a reason we could not run our annual show (like last year). Having these extra funds is exactly why we were able to continue to provide programming and waive membership fees during the Covid shut down despite the loss of income from not running our show in 2021!

Professionally, no surprise here, Cynthia was a Strategic Planning Consultant and developed programs for organizational problems solving. She did strategic planning retreats for organizations for over 20 years. She worked with 14 hospitals, 2 airports, and numerous other non-profits to improve their operations. Obviously, the Venice Area Orchid Society has benefitted from her professional expertise and organizational guidance!

Cynthia has always been an activist and dedicated to community involvement. She lived and worked on Chicago's West Side in a minority community for 10 years doing community development work and fundraising; she was involved in some of the early civil rights work with her husband Bob.

Cynthia became interested in growing orchids while she still lived in Miami. She currently has a collection of about 100 plants that she grows in a modified carport - half of the roof is removed and replaced with transparent fiberglass panels, Donn Smart helped her install some roll down shades coming in from the sides which she uses when it is very cold, and she has 2 fans that she runs 24/7. She grows everything planted to dry out quickly on lava rock, clay pebbles/hydroton, or mounted on Cholla cactus skeletons. She waters every day with an irrigation system but does all fertilizing by hand. She doesn't like to repot any more, she grows a lot of Vandas but also loves Oncidium Sweet Sugar and Den aggregatum.

This energetic woman has lots of other hobbies including singing tenor in the Venice Chorale, volunteering for the Audubon society, and she plays all voices of Recorder in the Sarasota Early Music Consort. She also enjoys wild bird photography.

On March 2nd during the Englewood show set up, a Black Racer slithered out of Gunther Lobisch's monster Lus. discolor plant. Shocked, our display team gasped and stepped back. Not Janet. She stepped forward and grabbed the snake behind its head, then calmly carried it outside to set it free. Black Racers are aggressive and can bite but they are not poisonous and they help to control the fruit rat population. In other words, they are good snakes.

The annual **Tamiami International Orchid Festival** will be held in the Miami Dade County Fair Expo Center May 13 – 15, 2022. March Meeting Plant Table Awards

First Place Blue Ribbon was awarded to Stephanie Luberger for her lovely pink and dark pink-spotted Cattleya (C.) Amethystoglossa. Cattleya amethystoglossa (the "amethyst-lipped Cattleya flower") is a bifoliate species of the orchid genus Cattleya. This orchid is native to Brazil in the state of Bahia on the Eastern coast growing in palm tree trunks, rock outcrops, and large tree branches high in the canopy of evergreen trees – at elevations around 1968 feet. It also grows in at sea level of Espiritu Maria near the Atlantic Ocean. Nevertheless, it loves growing in bright, airy, humid locations there, so hobbyists in Venice live in the perfect place to cultivate this plant! Our local vendor Palmer Orchids, who sells this gorgeous plant, suggests on their website: "Grow in bright light and high humidity. Plants must dry out before watering but will dry quickly out in the hotter months of the summer. Daily watering may be necessary in the summer, depending on the potting medium used." Congratulations Stephanie for cultivating such an excellent specimen!



March 2022 Meeting Plant Table Awards Continued

Here are the qualifications for such an award on the (AOS) American Orchid website: “The CCE is awarded to the exhibitor of a well-flowered specimen plant of robust health. The plant must have been in the care of the exhibitor at least 12 months immediately prior to the award and must score at least 90 points on a 100-point scale. Plants receiving this award represent the highest level of orchid culture.” Often called the ‘Jewel Orchid’ it is one of the few orchids not primarily grown for its flowers, but for its beautiful foliage of green leaves with red veins. However, Gunther’s plant was most striking FOR its flowers – hundreds of them making for a beautiful circular artform. *Ludisia discolor* hails from Burma, Indonesia, and Malaysia and is a terrestrial orchid needing a potting mix that retains a fair amount of moisture or New Zealand sphagnum moss. Congratulations, Gunther, for your cultivation awards for such a spectacular plant!!



Third Place Yellow Ribbon was awarded to Carol DeVirgilio for her frilly *Dendrobium* (*Den.*) *spectabile*. It's an orchid species identified by Blume in 1859 and introduced and described worldwide by Friedrich Anton Wilhelm Miquel in 1859. The decorative *Den. spectabile* grows mostly at elevations of 1,000–1640 feet and especially likes to grow on coconut trees! Unlike most orchids, it is popularly sought after due to its semi-sweet intense fragrance, bright foliage, and its size; Carol's plant exceeded two feet. It's special because the 3-inch flowers are yellow-brown and grooved with 5-8 nodes below the leaves. The flower's crested lip is yellowish with a white base. The sharply pointed segments are twisted and curled and blossoms have been described as grotesquely beautiful. Such a description! Well, we're so glad that Carol brought this happy specimen to VAOS. Congratulations, Carol for a well-grown plant.

Home Drilled Clay/Terra Cotta Orchid Pots

Since unglazed Clay or Terra Cotta orchid pots (those with the extra holes in the sides) are so difficult to find, following are directions for adding holes to standard, unglazed Clay or Terra Cotta pots found in virtually any store selling lawn & garden supplies.

Items Needed:

Standard Electric Drill

Spray bottle with plain water (for lubrication)

Empty container (3-4" in diameter and 3-4" tall. I used an empty 1 lb coffee can)

½" or 5/8" CARBIDE MASONRY Drill Bit (available at any hardware store)

Unglazed Clay or Terra Cotta Flower pots

Directions:

Fill spray bottle with water

Add a few inches of water to empty container.

Attach drill bit to drill.

Spray the pot with a little water where you want the new holes to be.

Slowly, and using minimal pressure, start to drill into the pot.

After 2-3 seconds, stop the drill, dip the tip of the drill bit in the container with water to cool and re-lubricate the drill bit

Immediately continue the drilling process, for another 2-3 seconds.

Repeat Steps a & b until you have made the desired number of holes in your pot.

Brush or Rinse out the pot to remove any dust.

Note: It goes very quickly! Don't press down too much with the drill. Rather, let just the weight of the drill apply to pressure. Using this process, I drilled 3 holes in each of 5 pots in less than 10 minutes. The trick is to use the water to lubricate the drill bit. It doesn't take much! I practiced on a broken piece of clay pot first, just to get the process down. It works great! Below is a photo of the finished pot.



April Growers Clinic
Hands-on Orchid Repotting Clinic
Thursday, April 14, Venice Community Center, 7pm

Rick Belisle and the Growers Clinic team will lead a Hands-on Orchid Repotting session at the Venice Community Center at 7:00 p.m. Rick and the Growers Clinic Team will explain the supplies, tools and planting media, demonstrate basic procedures and share their tips of the trade. Participants will then replot their own orchid with the assistance of several experienced growers and helpers. We will work in teams of 4 or 5 around a table with each person bringing an orchid that needs repotting as well as a suitable pot to replant the orchid and a sterile pair of shears.

With only two hours available and a large turnout expected, it is critical that everyone adhere to the instructions below:

- **All plants must be removed from their pot and all old planting media and dead roots must be removed prior to the clinic**
- *Only one plant per person**
- **Bring your pot and shears**
- **Please make sure your plant is free from pests or diseases.**

Media and supplies for most orchids will be provided.

Bring your problem plants for expert help. Guests are welcome.


