Topic: New Research & Conservation of Florida **Orchids**

Award-winning botanist Dr. Tatiana Arias joined the staff of Marie Selby Botanical Gardens in November 2021 as an orchid researcher. An innovative scientist who earned a Ph.D. at the University of Missouri, Arias comes to Sarasota from her native Colombia, where she has been leading a Officers research lab focused on orchid genomics, horticulture, and conservation.

Dr. Arias is a classically trained botanist who has kept up with modern methods. Her interest in pursuing novel approaches to science is refreshing. Tatiana brings to us a passion for orchids as well as broad connections to the botanical world and to the Andes, where the greatest region of orchid diversity is found.

Dr. Arias has more than 15 years of experience working in plant sciences. She has been honored by the World Academy of Sciences and The Colombian Academy of Sciences, among other professional achievements. "I am passionate about and committed to diversity in academia," Tatiana said. <u>All volunteers should enter the building through the rear entrance</u>. A volunteer will verify your assignment from our list, give you a name tag and provide directions. Your Blooming Plants Are Needed!

VAOS Annual Orchid Show & Sale

Show: Saturday February 4th and Sunday February 5th

Set up: Friday February 3rd, 1pm – 7pm

Location: Venice Community Center 326 Nokomis Ave. S., Venice, FL 34285

Our 56th annual VAOS Show and Sale. Show hours are Saturday 10am - 5pm and Sunday 10am -4pm. Take down is Sunday 4pm.

Your blooming plants are needed to create a winning display! Bring your plants to our February 2nd (Thursday) monthly meeting or drop them off at the Venice Community Center rear entrance on Friday, February 3rd, by 11am.

All plants must be registered in advance via email between Sunday January 29th and Wednesday February 1st.

Email your plant name with a <u>photo of the flower</u> or color description and flower size to <u>PlantReg@VAOS.org</u>.

Look for a return email confirming your plant registration with a number to attach to your plant. This will facilitate display set up at the show.

Plants should be cleaned, staked, free of pests and disease and labeled with both the plant name and the owner's name. Flowers should be in prime condition to last through the weekend show. Please water your plants thoroughly.

HOW TO PREPARE YOUR PLANT FOR THE SHOW

Groom Your Plant

Remove dead or brown leaves and pseudobulbs from the plant. Clean the pseudobulbs and leaves (water helps to soften the dry papery covering around pseudobulbs so that you can gently rub it off). Trim dead areas from leaves. Cut following the basic shape of the natural leaf ending if possible.

Wipe the top of the leaves (vinegar, lemon juice, sprite, 7 up, etc.) to remove residue. Do not use commercial spray to shine the leaves.

Make sure the media in the container is clean. Remove trash, debris, dead leaves or stems and weeds from the pot.

Pests or Diseases

While prepping orchids for a display, check for pests and disease. Check the leaves and pseudobulbs for a white cottony substance, an indication of mealybugs. Hard, whitish bumps may mean scale and if any are found remove them with alcohol and a Q-tip. If there is a bad infestation, do not bring the plant to the show. Check for other pests such as snails, slugs and ants. Inspect the flowers for thrips and other damage. If a flower is marred by the spots it is better to leave the plant at home.

Stakes

Carefully stake the spike that will present the flowers to their best advantage. If you can plan ahead of time, it is best to stake the spike as it emerges; an older spike is harder and can break off easier. Stakes are often needed to support the flower spike but should not distract the eye. Keep them looking as natural as possible. Stakes should not protrude beyond the top of the last bloom flower, but should allow the flowers to be kept away from the foliage. It may also protect the flower spike from damage during travel to the show.

Remove any wire hangers, hoops, etc. Water each plant thoroughly before bringing to the show. If the plant is in a plastic pot, drop it into a clay pot for stability. Place each plant carefully in a large box or container for transport. To keep the plants from moving around you can put rolled newspapers around the pots.

Labels

Ensure your plant has it's name tag. Also tape a piece of masking tape with your name on it to the side of pot. This is how the Team knows the plant owner so it will be returned to you.

UPDATE ON EAOS ANNUAL SHOW MARCH 3-4

The hurricane has dealt us another blow that we were not expecting. I had spoken to the people at Ann & Chuck Dever Regional Park in December and was assured that we would be able to have our show there as planned. The facility was being used as a Red Cross Shelter through December.

The problem now is that the county is waiting on the Red Cross and the insurance company to repair the damage to the facility. They had over 70 people living there for over 3 months, so you can imagine the condition that it was in. They now project that they will not have use of the gym till April or after.

We have now secured a new location:

Tringali Community Center 3460 N Access Rd Englewood, Fl. 34224

(Going south on 776, pass WalMart, the light at Winchester, the light at Gulfstream, take the second turn lane on the street at the Tringali complex.)

Unfortunately, where we had over 9,000 sq. ft., we now have a little over 2,600, which is quite a difference. This is not going to give us as much room as we would like, but at the time, it is the best that we can do. I am sure it will all work out and we'll have a great show, non the less.

I am really sorry about this change but we'll all do the best we can and put on a great show.

Yellow Bird, flowing into yellow Oncidiinae, mixture of species and hybrids is excellent, flower quality is very good, labelling is clear and unobtrusive, a sign welcomes viewers of the exhibit to paradise while they enjoy the exhibit, a white tropical heron accents the display on the left, in keeping with the theme of Orchids in Paradise.
