

A. Basic Needs - FLAW:

- a. <u>F</u>ood
 - i. Weekly, Weakly
 - ii. At ½ recommended strength
 - iii. Feed first, then water
- b. <u>L</u>ight
 - i. Palm "Shadow" Test
 - ii. Thick leaves (Phals i.e. Moth orchids), lower light
 - iii. Medium leaves (Cattleya, Dendrobium, etc.), medium light
 - iv. Thin Leaves (Vandas with roots hanging), high light
- c. <u>A</u>ir
- i. No soil!
- ii. Pots: Clay or plastic, with holes; baskets, or mounted, using "zip ties"
- iii. Media: (No Sphagnum Moss in Florida!)

Orchid Bark	<u>L</u> ight <u>Expanded</u> <u>C</u> lay <u>Aggregate</u> (LECA)
Coconut Husk	Lava Rock
Wine Corks	Perlite
Natural Cypress Mulch	Pumice

- d. <u>W</u>ater
 - i. "Damp Finger/Bamboo Skewer" Test or "Pot Weight" Test
 - ii. Water until the "sponge" turns green (takes less than a minute)
 - iii. Brrrrrr...NO Ice!
 - iv. No "wet feet" I.e., no sitting in water
- B. Temperatures: When you're comfortable, they're comfortable!
- C. Easy-to-grow orchids for "beginners" and availability
 - a. Phalaenopsis (Moth Orchid): "Big Box Stores" and Orchid Shops
 - b. Cattleya family (Corsages): Some Big Box Stores, HoneyBee, Orchid Envy
 - c. Dendrobiums (Keikis, long lasting blossoms): Same as Cattleyas
 - d. Oncidiums (some smell like chocolate): Same as Cattleyas
- D. Pests, Diseases
 - a. BioAdvanced Insect, Disease & Mite Control (Blue Bottle)
 - b. Alcohol (undiluted)
 - c. Hydrogen Peroxide (undiluted)
 - d. Cinnamon (Never on Roots!)
 - e. Slow-Release: Nutricote or Dynamite (Red can)
